Karla FC Holloway (@ProfHolloway on Twitter) is James B. Duke Professor Emerita of English, Law, and African-American Studies at Duke University where she co-founded the John Hope Franklin Center and Institute and served as the Dean of Duke's Humanities and Social Sciences faculty.
