

L. Renée is a poet and nonfiction writer, who works as Assistant Director of Furious Flower Poetry Center and Assistant Professor of English at James Madison University. Nominated for Best New Poets, Best of the Net and two Pushcart Prizes, her work has been published in Obsidian, Tin House Online, Poetry Northwest, the minnesota review, Poet Lore, and elsewhere. The granddaughter of proud Black Appalachians, she won the international 2022 Rattle Poetry Prize and Appalachian Review's Denny C. Plattner Award, among others. Her writing—informed by oral histories, genealogical and archival research—has been supported by the Barbara Deming Memorial Fund, Inc., Oak Spring Garden Foundation, The Writers' Colony at Dairy Hollow, Monson Arts, and others. A recipient of fellowships from Cave Canem Foundation and the Watering Hole, L. Renée also holds an MFA in Creative Writing from Indiana University, and an MS in Journalism from Columbia University, where she was a Joseph Pulitzer II and Edith Moore Fellow.
